Beginning June 1, 2022 and ending May 31, 2027 Superior Waste Removal Inc., under contract with The Village of Elbridge will be collecting your trash and recyclables every **Tuesday**.

All items must be at the curb prior to 6AM

All trash must be:

Contained in the 65gal receptacle provided to you from the company. It is appreciated if the containers are easily handled/lifted by our employees. Containers that are unmanageable, has loose trash, filled with water/ice/snow may not be taken. If an additional container is needed, or you need a larger trash container please contact Superior to discuss options.

Accepted as trash:

Normal waste accumulated in the preparation of food, packaging of food (non-recyclables) and items of a similar nature that are subject to decay. Rubbish that includes paper, rags, bottles, cans, and similar waste that are not recyclable, refuse.

Excluded from trash pick-up:

Hazardous waste, paint, tires, batteries, furniture, TV's, monitors, computers, construction material or debris (defined as any item once connected to the inside or outside of house) including deck/fencing material, motor vehicle or any part thereof, swimming pools or any part thereof including liner or cover, outdoor statuary or similar decorations, central heating/AC units or components, any unit containing or has previously contained gas or oil. **Loose glass, swing sets, slides, basketball units, or any similar children's large recreational apparatus. Yard waste, including dog waste.**

Recyclables:

Recyclable materials must either be placed in blue bins, or the recycling container provided to you from Superior. **Recycling must not be placed in plastic bags.** Large boxes must be broken down. Holidays: The weeks of **Memorial Day** Monday May 30th, **Independence Day** Monday July 4th, **Labor Day** Monday September 5th. If your collection day falls on or after an observed holiday your collection day will be the day after the normal pick-up day and will return to normal collection schedule the following week. Unless otherwise noted all other holidays will remain on regular schedule. **Holidays that fall on the weekend will not be observed during the week.**

Recycle it, but NOT at your curb

Electronics (computers, TVs, etc.) Search OCRRA.org for drop-off locations.

Fluorescent light bulbs (household only) Recycle CFLs at your local Home Depot or Lowe's. Many Ace and True Value hardware stores also accept 4-foot tube, circular and U-shaped bulbs.

Microwaves and dehumidifiers Bring to OCRRA's Ley Creek Transfer Station.

Mercury thermometers and thermostats Bring to OCRRA's Ley Creek Transfer Station.

Household batteries Drop off at any Onondaga County Wegmans or Green Hills Market.

Food scraps Visit OCRRA.org for compost solutions.

Trash it

Plastics All plastics including "clamshells" (e.g., berry containers) go in the trash EXCEPT: • Plastic bottles and dairy tubs—they go in the recycling bin.

Tires Search OCRRA.org for locations that accept tires.

Carpeting, mattresses, and broken furniture Bring to OCRRA's Ley Creek Transfer Station

Pressure-treated wood Bring to OCRRA's Ley Creek Transfer Station.

Egg cartons (paper, plastic and Styrofoam)

Styrofoam

EMPTY antifreeze, fertilizer, herbicide or pesticide containers If they still contain material, make a Household Hazardous Waste appointment by visiting OCRRA.org/hhw or calling (315) 453-2866.

Fire extinguishers Search OCRRA.org for drop-off locations.

Syringes, sharps and needles: NEVER go in the recycling bin. They can harm employees who handle them. Place in a plastic laundry detergent bottle, tape the screw-on cap shut, label with "Sharps" and put in trash.

Medication: Search OCRRA.org for disposal options.
