

RECYCLING CURBSIDE

- Boxes: Cardboard, takeout pizza, pasta, cereal, etc. Empty and flatten.
- Cartons: Milk, juice, soup, etc. (plastic spouts = OK) Empty, rinse and reattach cap.

RECYCLABLES DON'T BAG



# (IGNORE NUMBERS; RECYCLE BY SHAPE

- Bottles: Beverage, soap, shampoo, squeeze, spray, etc. (no bottles that held toxics) Empty, rinse and reatlach cap.
- jelly, etc.
- Jugs (items with a handle): Milk orange juice, water, detergent windshield fluid, etc.
- alternative only): Butter, yogurt, Stackable tubs (dairy/dairy cottage cheese, etc. Empty, rinse and reattach lid
- Plastic bags (clean and dry) and retail stores. Recycle at large grocery
